Your surgery should advise you in advance if a prescription is being delivered. Also be very cautious of anyone who phones or 'door knocks' selling things, offering services or to carry out repair work. You can all us at any time On the number blow.

Life in the Time of Corona*

There can be no doubt that self-isolating in the Hilltop Villages is, for most of us, much simpler than for many of our fellows in towns and cities. It is a joy to hear only bird song and insects without the usual hum of traffic and if you have bird feeders there is always something to watch. As well as my usual visitors I have had collared doves for the first time in a while and, early each morning, a pair of red-legged partridge. Recently, on a warm sunny day, I left my front door open and had a surprise visit from a tiny, brown bird about the size of a wren. It had a long narrow, curved beak and was all the wrong shape for a wren. Sorry no photos since I was trying to help it back outside! It was a tree creeper. What it was doing in the house I don't know but it was a pleasure to see one close up.

I am amazed at how many animals visit to eat the scattered seed below the feeders. I have daily visits from muntjac – sometimes more than one at a time, rabbits and squirrels. In the past I have also had a fox and am fortunate that there aren't rats at the moment. For very keen gardeners these animals would be a scourge but, if you are self-isolating, it is a pleasure to watch them. Hard to imagine how much nourishment they get from licking seeds out of wood chips but they do seem to really enjoy it.
