The Chairman proposed the following resolution:

This Council Objects in the strongest terms to the planning application PL/21/0690/FA - Land Adjacent to Cholesbury Lane (OS Field 4800), Cholesbury Lane, Buckland Common, Buckinghamshire which seeks a temporary period of three years for use of land to residential for members of the Traveller community

The proposal is very clearly contrary to:

- National Green Belt policy
- Chilterns AONB and related landscape policies
- Local Plan and Core Strategies policies
- National Planning Policy Framework
- Government Planning Policy for Traveller Sites

Most importantly the concerns of the Local Community

The objections like those heard from the residents in this community tonight to the devastating impact such a development has already had and will continue to have on the rural character of area, the impact of noise, lighting and loss of outlook and peaceful enjoyment

Additional Specific Issues

The so called 'temporary requirement' needs rebutting strongly.

- The inconsistency of the planning application and the activity and unlawful development that has already taken place on the site.
- Impact on natural environment including the already wanton damage and clearance of trees and hedges etc Impact on locations of public access from footpath
- Access changed
- Errors in Application and additional information document

Under each the above headings and any others identified the Chairman will, following this meeting, draft in conjunction with parish Council colleagues its response to Buckinghamshire Council incorporating views received from residents tonight.

The resolution was seconded by Cllr Ingram and following further discussion and consideration by Parish Councillors was unanimously approved by the Council.
