The Meeting of the Parish Council took place at St Leonards Village Hall on Monday, 28th March 2022 at 6pm

5516) Reports from Buckinghamshire Councillors

Cllr Birchley highlighted the following:

- Police initiatives continue with a new 'Do the right thing' campaign recently launched in Thames Valley addressing men to recognise and callout sexism and harassment.
- In May 2022 there is a Road Safety Summit taking place bringing together local councils, highways and Thames Valley Police. The Police and Crimes Commissioner would like to make our roads safer for all users.
- A Rural Taskforce has been launched and has already recovered £400,000 worth of trailers, caravans and farming equipment which had been stolen. The taskforce is also looking into money laundering connected with rural crime which ultimately can be linked into organised crime.
- Buckinghamshire has had the 2nd highest expressions of interest from families wanting to volunteer to offer Homes for Ukraine refugees. The first family has already arrived in the county in Chesham.
- Buckinghamshire Council continues to lobby HS2 on behalf of residents and the huge impact on the communities due to road damage, traffic and road closures.
- Buckinghamshire, in the last 12 months, has contributed £18billion to the economy of Great Britain and exports from the county account for £3.7billion annually.
- The Village Forum took place on the 23rd March 2022 and was led by Cllr Chris Brown. Action notes will be circulated in due course.

Cllr MacBean advised she had visited several roads with Highways Officers and highlighted concerns of the Parish Council due to inaction. Cllr Brown said this was much appreciated as the frustrations over lack of progress had also been raised again in March to Transport for Bucks and Buckinghamshire Council senior managers. It was noted as a result of persistent lobbying TfB has at long last agreed to get the bore hole at Sandpit Hill inspected and improving the drainage via grips and gullies on the slopes on either side of the hill would also be inspected

5517) To suspend standing orders and invite questions from members of the public No members of public were present.

5518) Reports

(a) Chairman's Report and Questions to the Chairman

Cllr Brown had attended meeting with Buckinghamshire Council and ecologists. The Council are planning to pilot the implementation of 'cut and collect' of grass verges which will improve the quality of verge management and increase the diversity of wildlife. This has been successfully trialled in other areas country i.e. Dorset and as a result of councils have cut back on four cuts per year to a maximum of two per annum. The Chairman has put the parish forward to be part of the pilot.

(b) Clerk's Report

It was noted that although the Parish Council have recently co-opted a new councillor, there is still one vacancy available for co-option following the elections in 2021, and one other outstanding vacancy arising from a subsequent councillor retirement. A notice will be put up the noticeboard for 14 days.

The new Cholesbury noticeboard, located in the car park of the cricket club, has now been Installed.

The Clerk referred to new NALC guidance on the Death of a National Figure. Councillors agreed to a small working party comprising the Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Clerk.

(c) Update on Broadband Project

Cilr Ingram reported that Openreach has apologised for the errors which led to 'threatening emails' sent to residents about broadband vouchers becoming invalid. Openreach has given assurances that there will be no financial burden on any of the 390 addresses to be served by the Openreach project. The full project is still on target for a 12th June 2022 delivery date.

The fibre project for addresses on the Wendover exchange is now on a priority list that Openreach has forwarded to the DCMS. It is hoped the Gigabit Voucher pledging portal should be open shortly.

5521) Queens Platinum Jubilee

The Chairman has written to the various groups and organisations in the parish to ascertain the events that are planned or considered over the Jubilee weekend. Zurich Insurance, the parish council's insurance provider, has offered specific insurance cover for Jubilee events. The parish council have been in discussion with groups about this.

Councillors discussed the outstanding Highways issues noted in Appendix 2. Cllr Macbean said she would continue as previously to follow up on a number of matters raised.

(b) Other highways matters

(i) Electricity Substation Cholesbury Common

The Chairman reported the parish council and some residents in Hawridge and Cholesbury had been notified of the application to consent under Section 38 of the Commons Act 2006 on behalf of UK Power Networks who are proposing to carry out works on the Common to install a GRP Substation and associated cabling. It is understood the landowner of the Commons had negotiated a suitable location which ensured the structure would not be visible. The parish council noted and would respond to the application.

(ii) Sign cleaning in the parish

Cllr Brown agreed to send the list of road signs to Cllr Ingram, who has a contact that may be able to undertake this work on behalf of the parish council.

Cllr Matthews advised the Common will have its first cut in July.
